NOTES OF BARNSTORMERS MEETING OF July 9, 2001

ATTENDANCE

There were 26 members present.

OFFICER REPORTS

President: John Howe asked about visitors and new members at the meeting. Daniel Scahill introduced himself as a new member. Also, Don Coleman was visiting.

Treasurer: Bob Elsner reported a balance in the bank of \$3417.52.

Vice President: John Janninck said that Butch Olanosa would be providing the entertainment this evening. (see entertainment)

Secretary: Scott Taylor had some aluminum plates with numbers stamped on them that can be used to make frequency pins. Simply glue them onto a close pin. These were made by Orvil Fluharty and are available for most frequencies.

COMMITTEES

Fun Fly: Jim Paroline said that Fun Fly #3 is scheduled for July 22nd. Touch and go poker and a climb and glide are on the agenda. Last year the T&G poker was loads of fun. Just a reminder, you don't have to be an expert to fly in these events.

Safety: Charlie Baxa reminded everyone to be careful when your engine is running. Never reach over your prop and keep your plane secured on the ground. One of our members needed 14 stitches to close a cut from a propeller while flying at the Nationals. He had a poor grip on a hand-launched airplane.

Charlie reported that we have recently had a number of new visitors to the field, Bird Watchers. These individuals have been walking out into the field without regard for the aircraft overhead. If you see these individuals, please warn them they should not be on the field, and if they don't heed the warning, be careful to avoid them.

Charlie added that he is now working at Al's Hobby Shop. Recently, Al's was contacted to see if they had any Byron kits. Byron had gone out of business and another company would like to re-open them. Unfortunately, of the wing molds have been destroyed. They would like to buy examples of wings from any of the following kits; Byron 58, Cap 21, Christian Eagle, Pitts Special, and BD-5. BUSINESS

Flight Stand Repair: Jim Scahill asked if anyone was planning to repair the flight stand and offered to provide several sets of new rails for the transmitters.

Open House: Scott Taylor thanked everyone for participating in the Open House. Although public attendance was not great, we did fly about 15 trainer flights, and gained several new members.

PLANES

David West brought in his latest foam creation, an electric powered Grumman F7F Tigercat. It is powered by twin Astro 035 motors running off 10 cells. Dave plans to fly this plan in combat.

Scott Hurley showed his latest SPAD airplane, a SPAD Stick. This model uses an aluminum spar and 4mm and 2mm corrugated plastic board in the laminated wing.

Ray Essick showed us his nearly completed SPAD V-tail. He expects to have it flying soon.

John Howe had two planes to show off. First, was an electric park flyer called the Husky. It is powered by a small electric motor and runs on a 7.2 volt 270 milli-volt battery. The model included the miniature radio and servos. Total weight is about 10 ounces, flight times run around 10 minutes, and top speed is about 7 miles per hour.

John also showed a Scimitar which is a .40 size flying wing design that uses elevons. It has a fiberglass fuselage and foam wing cores. He says it flies like a pattern ship but is difficult to get off the ground.

ENTERTAINMENT

Butch Olanosa gave an excellent presentation on computer radios. He is most familiar with the JR radios but talked about both JR and Futaba. The different features of the radios were discussed. Mixing of channels on a computer radio was a discussion in itself, since there are many useful reasons for mixing channels.

Butch handed out two printed documents that covered the radio features and how and why to mix different channels.


